Domenico Lombardi is president of The Oxford Institute for Economic Policy and Senior Fellow at the Brookings Institution.

Dr. Lombardi is a member of the *Financial Times* Forum of Economists. He serves as Editor of the *World Economics Journal* and sits on the Board of Directors of New Rules for Global Finance as well as on the Advisory Boards of the Bretton Woods Committee, the G-20 Research Group, the G-8 Research Group and the Istituto Affari Internazionali.

Dr. Lombardi has previously been a member of the Executive Boards of the International Monetary Fund and the World Bank. Earlier on in his career, he served at the Bank of Italy.

His academic interests focus on the global economy and currencies, global governance, the G-20, the G-8, and the reform of the international financial and monetary system. Dr. Lombardi's research has been published in peer-reviewed journals and has been referred to in Congressional and Parliamentary hearings around the world. He has testified before the U.S. Senate Committee on Banking, Housing, and Urban Affairs and the Subcommittee on Security and International Trade and Finance.

Most recently, he served as the rapporteur for the High-Level Panel on the Governance of the Financial Stability Board. In 2010, he was appointed by the World Bank Group's Board of Directors as the External Reviewer to conduct the Independent Review of the Group's Oversight and Accountability Units. A year earlier, Dr. Lombardi authored the Report to the IMF Managing Director on IMF Governance Reform ("Fourth Pillar Report"), which he presented before the Fund's Executive Directors.

His latest books include *Asia and Policymaking for the Global Economy*, with Kemal Derviş and Masahiro Kawai, published in April 2011 by the Brookings Institution Press, and *Finance, Development, and the IMF*, with James Boughton, released from Oxford University Press in 2009.

Dr. Lombardi is a regular commentator for the leading international press, including the *Financial Times*, the *Wall Street Journal* and the *Washington Post*, for the global newswires *Bloomberg* and *Reuters*, as well as for major TV networks like *BBC*, *CNN* and *Fox News*.

Dr. Lombardi has an undergraduate degree in Financial Economics from Bocconi University, Milan, and he did his postgraduate studies at Harvard University, The London School of Economics and Oxford University's Nuffield College, from which he holds a Ph.D. in Economics.
